1. Executive Summary

Council resolved to investigate the removal of the bus stop outside St Charles' Primary School on Carrington Road with Transport for NSW at the 12 April 2022 Council meeting (CM/8.3/22.04).

Council officers have undertaken investigation and received advice from Transport for NSW and the School.

The investigation shows that the Bus Zone is only occupied in the afternoon by one school bus service.

It is recommended that Council moves the Bus Zone to the location of the existing Kiss and Go Zone and the Kiss and Go Zone to the location of the existing Bus Zone. In addition:

- The Bus Zone length is to be extended from 26.4 to 30 metres
- The Kiss and Go Zone is to commence north of the driveway to No. 65 Carrington Road.

Figure 1 shows the existing locations of the Bus Zone and Kiss and Go Zone. Figure 2 shows the proposed locations for the Bus Zone and the Kiss and Go Zone.

Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

Council resolved to investigate the removal of the bus stop outside St Charles' Primary School on Carrington Road with Transport for NSW including consultation with the community and transport unions at the 12 April 22 Council meeting (CM/8.3/22.04).

Conditions at the existing Bus Zone and Kiss and Go Zone were observed on the morning of Thursday 11 August and the afternoon of Tuesday 9 August.

The morning drop off is random. Some parents park in the existing bus zone. There is no bus service in the morning.

The afternoon Kiss and Go Zone is fully occupied by 3.00 pm. School bus service 665E operates in the afternoon. The bus arrives around 3.15 pm. No passengers boarded the bus on Tuesday 9 August 2022.

The bus zone restrictions are not required in the morning as there are no buses in the morning. It is recommended that the morning restrictions are removed.

3. Technical Analysis

Council officers prepared two options for consideration:

- Option 1: Swap the two zones.
- Option 2: Swap the two zones and move the zones to be clear of a driveway to No. 65 Council Street.

The two options were reviewed by the Principal at St Charles' Catholic Primary School and Transport for NSW.

The Principal at St Charles Catholic Primary School advised that option 2 is preferred. Option 2 allows the kiss and go zone to be placed more directly in front of the school and facilitate safer arrival with the school's main gate approximately in the centre of the zone.

Transport for NSW advised no objection with option 2, providing the following conditions are met:

- The new bus stop is to be DDA complaint.
- Council is to bear the cost of the works.
- The total bus zone length to be 30 metres.




Figure 3. Proposed 90-degree parking angled parking spaces

The existing bus zone is 26.4 metres long. Figures 3 and 4 show Options 1 and 2 with a 30 metre bus zone.

Residents have been parking at 90 degrees at this location for many years. Nearmap images show the angle parking occurring back to at least 2009.

It is proposed to install signage to formalise the 90-degree angle parking spaces.

The site location is shown in Figure 1. Figure 2 shows the proposed works.

Residents of Grove Street have requested that 90-degree angle parking that has occurred in Grove Street for many years is formalised with signage. The request is in response to residents having been infringed because parallel parking applies without the signage.

An inspection of the aerial Images on previous dates of the area show that residents have indeed been parking 90-degrees at the suggested location.

Formalising the 90-degree angled parking at the location would also retain three on-street parking spots. Using the location as a parallel parking space would net just one parking space which would reduce the available on-street parking by two.

3. Technical Analysis

Three 90-degree angle parking spaces are proposed to be formalised at the southern side of Grove Street, at the frontages of no 11 and no. 9 Grove Street, Bondi.

Figure 3 shows the location of the proposed 90-degree angle parking spaces.

Currently, there are no restrictions on both sides of the lane. It is proposed to install No Parking restrictions on both sides of the lane (see Figure 2).

Placing "No Parking" restrictions on both sides of the laneway will facilitate access to the driveways at the end of Mason Lane.

2. Introduction/Background

In accordance with standard practice at Council, it is proposed that the construction zone is signposted 'No Parking 7 am—5 pm Mon—Fri, 8 am—3 pm Saturday Council Authorised Vehicles Excepted' for the approved construction hours as specified in the development consent. Council will supply the applicant with transferable permits to be used on the applicant's construction vehicles. The Traffic Committee and

Council's requirements for permit approvals are a minimum length of 9 metres along the site frontage with a minimum period of 13 weeks.

3. Technical Analysis

The subject site has a frontage of 9.7 metres on the eastern side of Wellington Street. The applicant has requested a 9-metre construction zone. Council officers propose to install a 9-metre construction zone.

Council officers propose to start the signposting of the construction zone on the driveway at the frontage of the site and extend up to the north of the tree at the boundary of 129 and 131 Wellington Street. The effective construction zone would be 10.5 metres as 1.5 metres of parking between the signposted zone and the driveway to the south would be too short to accommodate parked cars without intruding into the signposted zone.




Figure 3. Parking Controls






Figure 5. Notification area (hatched).

Council has received representations from Uniting Early Learning North Bondi day care (Centre) at 40 Warners Avenue, North Bondi, to install a 'P10 Minute 8.30 am-9.30 am, 3.30 pm-4:30 pm Mon-Fri' parking restriction on outside the day care centre. Figure 1 shows the site location.

The restriction is required to assist with dropping off and picking up children during the week. The Centre caters for 24 children per day. It is proposed that a 10.5 metre (2 car spaces) P10min zone is installed in Niblick Street as shown in Figure 2.

The matter was presented to the August 2022 Traffic Committee. The item was deferred to obtain more information. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

3. Technical Analysis

The Centre is located on the corner of Niblick Street and Warners Avenue, North Bondi. Parking outside the Centre is unrestricted and is occupied by long term parkers. The site has two frontages with 4 on-street parking spaces on Niblick Street and 3 on-street parking spaces on Warners Avenue. The two proposed drop off / pick up spaces are along the Niblick Street frontage.

Officers approached the Centre's operators and can confirm that the Centre operates 5 days a week every week, except for public holidays. It shuts down once a year for two weeks during the Christmas and New Year's break. The Centre cares for 24 children per day. Children are aged between 3 to 5 years old.

Parents that drive must leave their vehicles to check their children in and out. This takes between 5 to 10 minutes and on average 5 to 8 parents drop their children at any given time within the pick-up/drop off hour.

A similar restriction has been previously provided to other Centre providers, including:

- 1. Kindamindi Neighbourhood Children's Centre at 1 Illawong Avenue, Bondi ('P10 min 8am-9.30am, 3.30pm-6pm Mon-Fri').
- 2. Ocean Street Longday Preschool at 34 Ocean Street Bondi ('P10 min 7:30am-6pm Mon-Fri').

To increase turnover and improve the safety for children attending the Centre, a 'P10 min 8.30am-9.30am, 3.30pm-4:30pm Mon-Fri' parking restriction is recommended on Niblick Street directly outside the Centre as shown in Figure 2.
