- 2. Extends the 'P Motorbike Only' parking area outside 27 Hall Street and adjacent to 20–24 Hall Street in Jaques Avenue, including the following changes:
  - (a) Install 'P Motorbike Only' sign on new pole 3.1 m south of current position adjacent to 20–24 Hall Street in Jaques Avenue.
  - (b) Relocates the pole and existing 'P Motorbike' only sign 2.2 m west of current position outside 27 Hall Street.

#### WTC RECOMMENDATION (UNANIMOUS SUPPORT):

That Council:

- 1. Implements the following parking changes as part of a 12-month trial in Jaques Avenue and Hall Street, Bondi Beach:

### COUNCIL OFFICER'S PROPOSAL:

That Council installs a 1.8m Motorcycle only parking zone on the western side of Evans Street, Bronte between the driveways of No.373 Bronte Road.

### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received a request from a resident of the unit block at No.373 Bronte Road, Bronte to restrict parking between driveways to aid vehicular access. Council will need to exercise its delegated function to implement the proposal.

### 2. Introduction/Background

Austroads' document, *Guide to Traffic Management - Part 11: Parking,* states that motorcycle parking provision can be achieved by utilising under-size spaces. The Waverley Traffic Committee and Council have supported this principle and have previously been in favour of installing 'P Motor Bike Only' zones in short sections of kerb where other vehicles would obstruct vehicular access.

#### 3. Technical Analysis

The resident has communicated to Council, via their solicitor, that that they frequently experience difficulty accessing their property due to vehicles parking adjacent to the short section of kerb separating two large driveways. The driveways on either side of the proposed restriction are 9.0m wide.

The subject length of kerb in Evans Street between the driveways of No.373 Bronte Road is 1.8m. This length is insufficient to park a B85 vehicle (4.9 m long), without a vehicle overhanging at least one of the driveways.

The adjoining area on Evans Street has unrestricted parking.

#### 1. **Executive Summary**

Council has received a request to improve the traffic flow, sightlines and safety at the intersection of Alexander Street/Kenneth Street/Gaerloch Avenue, Tamarama. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

#### 2. Introduction/Background

This intersection is effectively the intersection of 3 roads on different alignments with Alexander Street/Gaerloch Avenue forming the through movement and Kenneth Street forming the 'T' of the intersection.

Alexander Street/Gaerloch Avenue provides a through link from Bondi Beach to Tamarama and is on a bus route (Route 361). As such, the lane widths must be sufficient (minimum 3.2m) to maintain bus operations.

A review of the crash history at this location shows one accident in the most recent 5 years data involving a vehicle turning from Alexander Street onto Kenneth Street hit from behind resulting in an injury.

This item is intended to address some of the difficulties caused by the off-set alignment between Alexander Street and Gaerloch Avenue and the limited sight distance for vehicles exiting Kenneth Street to the right/north.

#### 3. **Technical Analysis**

The sight distance to the right from Kenneth Street is currently 26m. Council has taken steps to maximise this distance by providing a 13m long No Stopping zone on the east side of Alexander Street on the approach to Kenneth Street. Expansion of the existing No Stopping zone will provide only marginal benefits due to the angle of approach.

By moving the intersection of Kenneth Street forward (west), it is possible to improve the sight distance to approximately 33m. This distance has been maximised by the locating the centreline on Kenneth Street to the south and providing a small painted island with RRPM's.

Observations at the site show that a significant proportion of motorists in Kenneth Street proceed past the current hold line to maximise sight distances along Alexander Street.

It is intended to move the intersection hold line forward onto the intersection by providing a painted island commencing 13m north of the intersection of Kenneth Street at a maximum 2.1m from the kerb tapering to 1.1m before curving to meet the northern kerb alignment of Kenneth Street.

An additional painted island will be provided on the southern side of Kenneth Street at a maximum of 1.4m from the existing kerb alignment

Due to the end position of the double barrier (BB) line on Gaerloch Avenue, motorists who are unfamiliar with the intersection have been observed driving to the right of the centre on Alexander Street. Installing an additional section of BB line on Alexander Street and altering the alignment of the BB line of Gaerloch Avenue will enhance the guidance through the intersection reducing potential vehicle conflict.

After initial discussions with Council's officers, the applicant has provided a Traffic Control Plan (TCP) to facilitate the crane delivery.



### COUNCIL OFFICER'S PROPOSAL:

#### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received a request from a resident to adjust (reduce) the length of the existing NO STOPPING restrictions on Francis Street east of Denham Street to allow vehicles to stop at driveways at the unit block at 34A Francis Street. The current NO STOPPING zone extends across the frontage of three garages.

#### 2. Introduction/Background

In 2009, Council constructed kerb blisters and realigned the intersection of Francis Street and Denham Street. The realignment serves to square up the intersection, slow traffic turning left from Francis Street into Denham Street and enhances pedestrian amenity.

The extension to the kerb and realignment has effectively moved the intersection of Francis Street with Denham Street some 12m to the west. The current NO STOPPING restrictions were in place prior to the construction of the kerb blister which has resulted in a long length of NO STOPPING.

This request is supported by the only other resident of 34A Francis Street whose driveway is within the current NO STOPPING zone.

### 3. Technical Analysis

The intention of this item is to allow for the resident of No.34A Francis Street to be able to utilise their driveway as a pick up and set down area.

The proposed length of NO STOPPING exceeds the statutory requirements for TDT 2012/12c from the new kerb alignment formed by the kerb blister.

#### **COUNCIL OFFICER'S PROPOSAL:**

That Council Installs 4.2m of Motorbike only zone on the northern side of Francis Street east of the driveway access of No.69-69A Francis Street.

#### 1. **Executive Summary**

Council has received a request to restrict the parking on a curved section of Francis Street, Bondi Beach, to prevent vehicles obstructing the driveway access of No.69-69A Francis Street.

#### 2. Introduction/Background

Due to the high demand for parking in the area, motorists have a tendency to park in any location which resembles a potential parking space. At the subject location, this can have an adverse effect on residential access and traffic flow.

Austroads' document, Guide to Traffic Management - Part 11: Parking, states that motorcycle parking provision can be achieved by utilising under-size spaces. The Waverley Traffic Committee and Council have supported this principle and have previously been in favour of installing 'P Motor Bike Only' zones in short sections of kerb where other vehicles would obstruct vehicular access.

#### 3. **Technical Analysis**

The subject section of kerb is curved and serves as a transition (45°) between the changes in carriageway width from 12m to 7.6m. Due to the angled alignment, vehicles which park parallel to the kerb can protrude into the driveway access, or into the travel lane.

The length of this transition section is 4.2m which is insufficient to accommodate the B85 and B35 standard vehicles.

#### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received representations from local residents requesting consideration be given to improving the sight distance and manoeuvrability for vehicles at the following intersection:

• Hall Street at Simpson Street, Bondi Beach

Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

#### 2. Introduction/Background

Residents have reported that sight distances and manoeuvrability are restricted by vehicles parked within the statutory 10m setback from the intersection of Hall Street and Simpson Street. It is considered signs or lines should be installed to reinforce the 10m setback.

Council has also resolved to undertake a review of all signs in the Waverley LGA with the aim of minimising the number of signs that are installed. As part of the review process, it is proposed to trial the use of yellow edge linemarking in lieu of 'NO STOPPING' signs at intersections without other parking restrictions.

#### 3. Technical Analysis

There are currently "No Stopping" signs on the:

- 1. West side of Simpson Street, south of Hall Street,
- 2. East side of Simpson Street, south of Hall Street,
- 3. East side of Simpson Street, north of Hall Street.

A number of inspections have taken place during the day revealing vehicles are often parked within the 10m statutory setback from the intersection. Vehicles parked illegally at these locations reduces driver sightlines and manoeuvrability. As compliance is an issue at this location, it is recommended that the legislative requirements be linemarked. There will be no nett loss of legal, on-street parking spaces.

#### Legislative Requirements

Under the [NSW] Road Rules 2014:

"A driver must not stop on a road within 10 metres from the nearest point of an intersecting road at an intersection without traffic lights, unless the driver stops ... at a place on a length of road, or in an area, to which a parking control sign applies and the driver is permitted to stop at that place under these Rules ...".

Therefore, vehicles parked at these locations may be infringed without the installation of additional signage or linemarking. However, the RMS's Technical Direction TDT 2002/12 *Stopping and Parking Restrictions at intersections and Crossings* addresses the installation of 'No Stopping' and 'No Parking' signs at intersections and states:

"It is not intended that signs be installed at all locations. Where signs are not installed the legislative restrictions will apply. Generally signposting of restrictions covered by legislative requirements is only required where there is adjoining signposting or compliance is an issue. However, signposting adjacent to children's crossings, pedestrian crossings and marked footcrossings should always

**occur**. The relevant road authority is to determine where NO STOPPING and NO PARKING signs are to be erected.

Existing signs, with the exception of NO STANDING signs (see Technical Direction No 99/21), are not to be removed or replaced until required under maintenance. Where the post is required to be replaced, the sign should be relocated to the new location as specified in this *Technical Direction*."

Under the [NSW] Road Rules 2014:

"A driver must not stop at the side of a road marked with a continuous yellow edge line".

#### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received several requests from local residents to install dedicated motorcycle parking in Edward Street, Bondi Beach. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

#### 2. Introduction/Background

Waverley Council has provided long-standing support for motorbike parking. Previously, at its meeting held on 15 April 2008 Council resolved:

#### That Council investigate:

- 1. Expanding the amount of designated on-street, time-limited free motorbike and scooter parking at Bondi Junction, Bondi Beach and Bronte Beach.
- 2. The provision of all-day commuter free parking for motorbikes and scooters at the Syd Einfeld Car Park, Bondi Junction and other places such as Council's car parks depending on feasibility.
- 3. Increasing the number of designated spaces available to motorbikes and scooters by at least 100% over the next five years.

Council regularly installs 'P Motor Bike Only' zones between driveways where there is insufficient kerb length for the parking of a passenger vehicle without overhanging driveway wings. This is in accordance with Austroads' *Guide to Traffic Management - Part 11: Parking*, which states that motorcycle parking provision can be achieved by utilising under-size spaces. However, in the vicinity there are no short sections of kerb between driveways where we could potentially install motorbike parking.

#### 3. Technical Analysis

An on-site inspection has confirmed a high demand for motorbikes parking in the eastern end of Edward Street, Bondi Beach.

There is currently, "2P 8am-10pm Permit Holders Excepted Area 21", 90° degree angle parking on the northern side of Edward Street terminating at a NO STOPPING zone immediately to the west of the driveway to the unit block at 1A Edward Street. The NO STOPPING sign is positioned on a street light post some 2m to the west of the driveway. In order to minimise the loss of angle parking and provide motor bike

only parking, it is proposed to reposition the NO STOPPING sign onto a new post and install 5 m of 'P Motor Bikes Only' parking immediately to the west of the driveway to 1A.



## 1. Executive Summary

Council has received representations from the resident at No. 13 Chaleyer Street to again give reconsideration to the installation of motorbike only parking between the driveways to properties 11 and 13 Chaleyer Street, Rose Bay. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

## 2. Introduction/Background

This matter was previously considered by the Waverley Traffic Committee at its meeting held on 27 June 2013. The Committee recommended that motor bike only parking NOT be installed between No's 11 and 13 having regard to objections being raised to the proposal by the owner of No. 11 Chaleyer Street. The owners of No. 13 have contacted Council again advising access to their property is an ongoing problem with vehicles being frequently parked close to the eastern side wing of their driveway and for there to be a review of the previous Council resolution.



## 3. Technical Analysis

The kerb between the driveways to 11 and 13 Chaleyer Street is only 3.4 m in length. This is insufficient to park a, B85 (4.9 m long) standard vehicle. One option to improve vehicular access to No. 13 in an attempt to keep vehicles clear of the driveway wings would be to widen the gutter crossing /layback on both sides. The driveway to No. 13 has drainage pits with lintels adjoin the driveway wings both sides. Relocating both pits away from the driveway wings would be chargeable to No. 13 and be a significant cost.

Council's Parking Officers have issued infringements at times to vehicles blocking access however, patrolling and issuing infringements does not move the vehicle and the problem continues.

### 1. **Executive Summary**

Council has received representations from Jewish Care community organisation on behalf of their disabled client requesting consideration be given to install a "No Parking" zone outside 21-25 Ramsgate Ave, Bondi Beach to assist with dropping off and picking up of their client who resides at that address. Council will be required to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

### 2. Introduction/Background

Currently there is a 8m long "P Disabled Only" zone outside 21-25 Ramsgate Avenue. The zone covers a concrete ramp which often gets blocked when vehicles are parked in that location. Jewish Care has requested that parking restrictions be installed across the ramp to keep it clear at all times so as to provide access to and from the roadway for disabled and elderly residents.

## 3. Technical Analysis

21-25 Ramsgate Avenue is located on the southern side of Ramsgate Avenue between Wairoa Avenue and Gould Street. Parking in Ramsgate Avenue is generally high demand and is controlled by "2P 8am-10pm permit holders excepted area 8 "restrictions. There is a "P Disabled Only" zone installed outside 21-25 Ramsgate Avenue to cater for frail residents.

Australian Standard AS 2890.5-1993 requires that parking spaces for use by people with disabilities be a minimum 5.5m long for end bay and 6.5m for middle bay. Currently the disabled zone outside 21-25 Ramsgate Avenue is 8m long including the kerb ramp. The parking in the vicinity is in high demand and the disabled zone is occupied most of the time by authorised vehicles blocking the kerb ramp. In order to assist with dropping off and picking up elderly and disabled residents, it is proposed to adjust signage and install a 3m long "No Parking" zone across the kerb ramp.




Figure 2. Proposed "No Parking"

  - Provides Public Liability Insurance for the event,

  - Notifies local residents and businesses at least seven (7) days prior to the event,
  - Uses only RMS-accredited Traffic Controllers are used to regulate traffic,
  - Covers all costs associated with traffic control,
  - Obtains approval from the Transport management Centre for the closure of Ramsgate Avenue
- 2. The Executive Manager, Creating Waverley and her representatives being delegated authority to audit the TMP and cancel the approval if required.

Council has received an application on behalf of North Bondi RSL Club requesting consideration be given to approving the temporary closure of Ramsgate Avenue, North Bondi in order to hold an ANZAC Day March and Dawn Service on Monday 25 April, 2016.. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

## 2. Introduction/Background

This event will be identical to the 2015 event and utilise the same TCP. Similar crowd numbers are anticipated at the 2016 event. This is considered to be a class 3 Special Event in accordance with the RMS's *Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events*.

This event will require an approval from the Transport Management Centre (TMC) as a temporary full closure is proposed. The applicant will be advised to contact the TMC to obtain the required approval.

Once all approvals have been received and all conditions have been met, Council's Executive Manager, Creating Waverley can issue a signed copy of the TCP for implementation.



- 1. Installs 5.5 m of 'P DISABILITY ONLY' parking outside 8 Roberts Street, Rose Bay.
- 2. Installs 5.5 m of 'P DISABILITY ONLY' parking outside 71 Curlewis Street, Bondi Beach.
- 3. Installs 6.5 m of 'P DISABILITY ONLY' parking outside 175 Blair Street, North Bondi.
- 4. Removes the existing 'P DISABILITY ONLY' zone outside 18 Queens Park Road, Queens Park.

## 1. Executive Summary

Council has received representations from residents requesting consideration be given to the installation of 'P DISABILITY ONLY' parking zones to improve access at:

- 1. 8 Roberts Street, Rose Bay.
- 2. 71 Curlewis Street, Bondi Beach.
- 3. 175 Blair Street, North Bondi.

Council has also been advised the existing 'P DISABILITY ONLY' zones are no longer required at:

1. 18 Queens Park Road, Queens Park.

Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

## 2. Introduction/Background

At the Waverley Traffic Committee meeting held on 10 November 2005, the issue of installing 'P Disability Only' parking was discussed. Subsequently, at the Council meeting held on 13 December 2005, it was resolved:

That the following guidelines for assessing applications for a mobility parking space on a residential street be adopted:

1. Together with proof of their mobility-parking permit, applicants for a mobility parking space must have a vehicle registered to their address. They do not need to be the driver of the vehicle.

- 2. Applicants who have access to off-street parking will not be entitled to a mobility parking space.
- 3. At least three site visits will be carried out of a morning and evening for each application. These site visits will also be carried out annually. The level of parking within 50m either side of the property must be at or above 85% capacity on each separate occasion.
- 4. Letters will be sent to residents annually to determine if the mobility parking space is still required. Residents will also be requested to again provide proof of current registration and their mobility-parking permit.

Under the [NSW] *Road Rules 2014*, Mobility Parking Scheme card holders are provided with the following concessions:

- Parking is permitted in 'P DISABILITY ONLY' zones.
- When parking in a metered, coupon or ticket parking area, no charge is applied

- Where parking is limited by a sign to more than 30 minutes, the vehicles can park for an unlimited time.
- Where parking is limited by a sign to 30 minutes, the vehicle can park for 2 hours.
- Where parking is limited by a sign to less than 30 minutes, the vehicle can park for a maximum of 30 minutes.
- When stopping in a 'No Parking' zone, the vehicle can drop off or pick up passengers or goods for a period of 5 minutes.
