Subject: Thompson Lane, Bondi Junction - No Stopping

#### **COUNCIL OFFICER'S PROPOSAL:**

#### That Council:

- 1. Installs a 15m long 'No Stopping' zone on the western side of Thompson Lane north from Birrell Street.
- 2. Replaces the existing 'No Parking' zone with the statutory 'No Stopping' zone on Birrell Street, north side, west of Thompson Lane.

#### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received representations from the resident of 45 St James Road, Bondi Junction requesting consideration be given to installing signage in Thompson Lane at the rear of the property to remove vehicles from being parked opposite and blocking access to the garage. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal

# 2. Introduction/Background

Due to increasing demand for similar requests, Council's policy is to apply the following criteria when assessing the technical aspects of motor vehicular access between the road reserve and adjacent land:

### **Development Application**

If the matter has been raised as part of the Development Application process, Council officers will not support a proposal to remove on-street parking to improve access between the road reserve and adjacent land.

#### <u>Left and/or Right In/Out Only</u>

Where there is an opportunity for drivers to access and egress off-street parking, unimpeded, through a left and/or right in/out only manoeuvre, Council officers will not support a proposal to remove on-street parking to improve access between the road reserve and adjacent land. It is acknowledged that drivers may need to travel further to access and egress their properties.

#### B85 Vehicle

Council officers will survey the driveway, off-street parking and surrounding road environment, to be drafted. Australian Standard *AS 2890.1: 2004* provides a turning template for 85 per cent of the registered passenger vehicles in Australia (B85 Vehicle) and this is to be used to assess the access between the road reserve and adjacent land.

If the access for a B85 Vehicle IS NOT impeded by vehicles legally parked on-street, Council officers will not support a proposal to remove on-street parking to improve access between the road reserve and adjacent land.

If the access for a B85 vehicle IS impeded by vehicles legally parked on-street, Council officers will refer the matter to the Waverley Traffic Committee and Council. The application to remove the parking is to be advertised by Council officers, by installing a notice in the vicinity of the on-street parking in question.

The matter has been referred to the Waverley Traffic Committee to assess the technical aspects of motor vehicular access between the road reserve and adjacent land.

Council will need to assess the wider issue of equity, having regard to the Traffic Committee's advice and Council's obligations under the *Roads Act 1993*:

- Waverley Council is the Roads Authority for Thompson Lane (Sec 7),
- a member of the public is entitled, as of right, to pass along a public road (whether on foot, in a vehicle or otherwise) and to drive stock or other animals along the public road (Sec 5(1)), and
- the owner of land adjoining a public road is entitled, as of right, to access (whether on foot, in a vehicle or otherwise) across the boundary between the land and the public road (Sec 6(1)).

The *Roads Act 1993* does not provide a right for members of the public to store private property, such as motor vehicles on the public road.

#### 3. Technical Analysis

A search of the development applications relating to the garage of 45 St James Road has revealed that parking in Thompson Lane was not raised as a concern by the applicant, local residents or Council. An inspection of the site has revealed that a B85 vehicle would not be able to egress the driveway without being impeded by vehicles when parked opposite- see figure 2 below. Therefore, it has been determined that the site falls into the third category above.

Thompson Lane is a two-way, 4.5m wide laneway providing vehicular access to properties fronting York Road and St James Road. Since the rear access to 45 St James Road is located only 15 metres from the intersection of Birrell Street, it is proposed to install 15m of "NO STOPPING" on the western side of Thompson Lane, north of Birrell Street to aid vehicular access to the property. This length will include 10m of statutory NO STOPPING. In addition, it is also proposed to replace the existing 'No Parking' zone located on the north-western corner of Thompson Lane and Birrell Street with the statutory 'No Stopping' zone.

#### **COUNCIL OFFICER'S PROPOSAL:**

#### That Council:

- 1. Installs a 10 m long 'No Stopping' zone on the western side of Illawong Avenue, south of Farrellys Avenue, Tamarama.
- 2. Installs a 12m long "P10 Minute 8.00am-9.30am; 3.30pm-6pm Mon-Fri" zone outside 1 Illawong Avenue, Tamarama adjoining the 10m long "No Stopping" zone.
- 3. Requires the applicant to meet the cost of supplying and installing the posts and signs associated with the "P10 Minute" parking zone.

#### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received representations from the assistant principal of the long day care centre at 1 Illawong Avenue, Tamarama seeking approval for the installation of a "P10" minute parking zone on Illawong Avenue directly outside the property to assist with dropping off and picking up children in the morning and afternoon. The centre caters for 32 children aged from 6 weeks to 5 years old. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

### 2. Introduction/Background

Property 1 Illawong Avenue, Tamarama is located on the south—western corner of Illawong Avenue and Farrellys Avenue, Tamarama. The property is owned by Council and has been used for child care purposes for some years.

# 3. Technical Analysis

The centre is located on the south-western corner of Illawong Avenue and Farrellys Avenue with no parking available onsite. Illawong Avenue and Farrellys Avenue are both local roads with a default speed limit of 50KPH. Farrellys Avenue is one way eastbound. The intersection is controlled by a 'STOP' sign with traffic in Illawong Avenue having to stop and give way to traffic in Farrellys Avenue. There is currently no time restricted parking in Illawong Avenue or Farrellys Avenue.

Having regard to the site being in close proximity to the busy Bondi commercial precinct and there being a high demand for street parking in both Illawong Avenue and Farrellys Avenue during much of the day and night including the centre's drop off and pick up times, it is proposed to install two spaces of P10 minute parking outside of the centre in Illawong Avenue as per *Figure 2* below.

It is considered installing P10 minute parking outside the centre will improve conditions for those dropping off and picking up children. P10 minute parking has been installed at other, similar centres.

#### **COUNCIL OFFICER'S PROPOSAL:**

That Council converts the section of Warners Avenue, Bondi Beach, between Wairoa Avenue and Campbell Parade, to a one way street and installs temporary kerb extensions, associated line marking and signage, as described in Attachment 3 – Concept Design.

# 1. Executive Summary

The proposed change to traffic conditions aims to improve pedestrian, bike and vehicle safety with temporary measures to test design outcomes for future capital works on Campbell Parade. The Campbell Parade Design Review has been adopted by Council for exhibition. Detailed design and construction will not take place for several years.

To improve the pedestrian environment of Campbell Parade, including improvements to an existing 46m road crossover, an interim design solution is proposed to create a way one street on Warners Avenue and extend the existing footpath. See Attachment 1 Site Photos and Alternative Route Plan.




Figure 1: Existing Site Plan

#### 2. Introduction/Background

The site consists of a pedestrian island dividing Warners Avenue, Wairoa Avenue and Campbell Parade, Bondi. The intersection between Campbell Parade and Warners Avenue was identified in the Campbell Parade Design Review as a hazard for pedestrians, particularly due it's the proximity to Bondi Beach Public School. Council aims to make this intersection safer, more compact, and easier to cross for pedestrians. The proposed change to traffic conditions will mitigate potentially dangerous intersection conflicts.

Council commissioned vehicle counts for the area and determined that the left turn onto Warners Avenue from Campbell Parade is not required as very few cars use this path (see Attachment 3: Traffic Counts). Converting this section of the road to a one-way street would allow reductions in intersection widths and pedestrian paths. This will also provide space for angled parking on the south side of Warners Ave and space for motorbike parking.

It is recommended that an interim design is implemented to improve pedestrian safety prior to design development and construction detailing of Campbell Parade which could take several years. New York City's Urban Streets Design Guide on pilot to permanent projects recommends the following:

"Interim design strategies allow cities to assess the impacts of their intended project in real time and realize their benefits faster than typical processes allow. While a majority of these interim designs go on to become full-scale capital projects, some are altered or redesigned in the process based on how they perform in real time. This results in a better final product and saves on future expenditures and improvements that need to be made in revision." Urban Streets Design Guide, 2013

# 3. Technical Analysis

Temporary asphalt kerbing and concrete planters will be installed along the roads edge as crash barriers. Kerb extensions will be clearly marked on the road and concrete planters and wine barrels will separate cars and pedestrians. See Attachment 3: Concept Plan.

Kerb extensions will be designed and installed to retain sight lines for people using the path. They will include reflectors to ensure visibility at night. Tactile indicators will be installed at the edges of the kerb extensions to ensure safety for less able pedestrians.

#### 4. Financial Information for Council's Consideration

Construction of the entire project will be funded from existing budgets.





Figure 4: Alternative Route Plan for cars leaving driveways on Warners Avenue



#### **COUNCIL OFFICER'S PROPOSAL:**

That Council:

- 1. Installs three, one way directional arrows (UA-1) on the circumferential roadway at The Plaza, Rose Bay,
- 2. Installs a 'ONE WAY' (left R2-2) sign in the circular reserve at The Plaza on its eastern side facing Onslow Street traffic.

### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received a petition signed by 48 residents of Onslow Street and Onslow Place, Rose Bay, requesting the installation of one way directional signage on Onslow Street at The Plaza, a circular roadway located at the eastern end of Onslow Street. Council will need to exercise its delegated function to implement the proposal.

# 2. Introduction/Background

Council has been advised that some drivers are travelling in an anti-clockwise direction around the circular road at The Plaza, Rose Bay. The alignment of this road is circular however, it is not technically a roundabout. Whilst it is logical and conventional to travel in a clockwise direction, some drivers are electing to travel in an anti-clockwise direction to either access properties or travel to Onslow Place on its southern side.

# 3. Technical Analysis

As traffic devices, both the directional arrows painted on the roadway and "one way" sign are enforceable and will require vehicles to only travel clockwise only around The Plaza. The "one way" sign will inform motorists approaching The Plaza from Onslow Street and the directional arrows will provide a reinforcement for those vehicles entering the circular road from residential properties.



#### 1. Executive Summary

Council has received an application from the builder/developer at No.36-38 Ocean Street, Bondi for the installation of a construction zone across the site frontage. Council will need to exercise its delegated function to implement the proposal.

# 2. Introduction/Background

In accordance with standard practice in Waverley Council, it is proposed that the Construction Zone be signposted 'No Parking Council Authorised Vehicles Excepted' for the approved construction hours under the DA Consent. Council will then issue the applicant with a number of transferable permits to be used on their construction-related vehicles.

The Traffic Committee and Council generally only approve construction zones at the same length as the frontage, regardless of the location of driveways, for a minimum of thirteen weeks.

#### 3. Technical Analysis

This section of Ocean Street North contains a mixture of 90 degree angle spaces and parallel to kerb parking spaces. It is intended to remove the 90 degree spaces during the operation of the construction zone and requiring construction vehicles to park parallel to the kerb only.


Figure 1. street view of 36-38 Ocean Street North.

Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

#### 2. Introduction/Background

The only change from previous years is the request to the RMS for the installation of Special Event Clearway on Bondi Road as follows:

- 9am 12pm, Bondi Road, Eastbound between Council Street and Sandridge Street;
- 12pm 6pm, Bondi Road, Westbound between Sandridge Street and Council Streets.

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This change has been requested following representations made to Council by **State Transit and NSW Police** to minimise the localised congestion and facilitate transport of the large crowds to and from the event.

The "Festival of the Wind" is a free community event held in Bondi Park and Beach featuring professional kite flying displays, kite making workshops, entertainment and food stalls. The event has grown over the years and now attracts 15,000+ visitors. This has had a significant impact on transport and traffic both within the immediate vicinity of the event and on the wider community.

This is a Class 2 Special Event under the RMS's *Guide to Traffic and Transport Management* for Special Events. The Traffic Committee is required to make recommendations to Council regarding the traffic management aspects of the event, advising Council on conditions to set for the use of road space. Council will then consider these recommendations and assess all other impacts on the surrounding environment before issuing a Schedule of Conditions. - a. The route to be taken by demolition/construction vehicles in the Council area when accessing and exiting the site.
- b. The type, size and number of demolition/construction vehicles for each of the separate phases of the development. Trucks with dog trailers and semi-trailers may not be approved for use if it is considered with the information provided that:
  - such vehicles cannot adequately and safely gain access to and from the site or
  - access into or out of the site may not be not possible without the need to remove an unsatisfactory number of vehicles parked on the roadway adjacent to or opposite the site.
- c. The location of truck holding areas remote from the site should Council not give approval for demolition/construction vehicles to stand on the roadway in the vicinity of the site.
- d. Traffic control measures to be put in place when trucks, manoeuvring in the vicinity of the site, will interfere with the free flow of traffic.
- e. The location and materials of construction of temporary driveways providing access into and out of the site.
- f. The location and length of any proposed Works/Construction Zones. Note: such zones require the approval of the Waverley Traffic Committee and Council prior to installation.
- g. The hours of operation of demolition/construction vehicles.
- h. The number of and where it is proposed to park light vehicles associated with staff/employees/contractors working on the site.
- i. How it is proposed to cater for the safe passage of pedestrians past the site. The details shall include:
  - The route required to be taken by pedestrians including signage and any other control measures that will need to be put in place to direct and keep pedestrians on the required route
  - Any obstructions such as street furniture, trees and bollards etc., that may interfere with the safe passage of pedestrians
  - The type(s) of material on which pedestrians will be required to walk
  - The width of the pathway on the route
  - The location and type of proposed hoardings

- The location of existing street lighting
- j. Any bus zones, taxi zones etc., that may be affected/require temporary relocation as a result development works.

#### **NOTE: PRIOR TO THE PREPARATION OF THE CVPPM**, the applicant or his or her representative shall:

- Make contact with Council's Senior Traffic Engineer on telephone 9083 8674 to discuss information required at (a) to (j) above.
- Make contact with the operators of bus and taxi services whose zones may be affected /require temporary relocation as a result of development works
- Be aware that the full length of Oxford Street may not be approved as a route for trucks when travelling to or from the site.

- e. The location and materials of construction of temporary driveways providing access into and out of the
- f. The location and length of any proposed Works/Construction Zones. Note:

- (i) Works/Construction zones require the approval of the Waverley Traffic Committee and Council prior to installation.
- (ii) It is illegal to:
  - park a vehicle exceeding 4.5tonnes on a roadway for more than one (1) hour unless signs are installed to the contrary..
  - barricade/reserve a section of roadway without the prior approval of Council.
- g. The hours of operation of demolition/construction vehicles.
- h. The number of and where it is proposed to park light vehicles associated with staff/employees/contractors working on the site.
- i. How it is proposed to cater for the safe passage of pedestrians past the site. The details shall include:

- The route required to be taken by pedestrians including signage and any other control measures that will need to be put in place to direct and keep pedestrians on the required route
- Any obstructions such as street furniture, trees and bollards etc., that may interfere with the safe passage of pedestrians
- The type(s) of material on which pedestrians will be required to walk
- The width of the pathway on the route
- The location and type of proposed hoardings
- The location of existing street lighting
- j. Any bus zones, taxi zones etc., that may be affected/require temporary relocation as a result of development works.

#### **NOTE: PRIOR TO THE PREPARATION OF THE CVPPM**, the applicant or his or her representative shall:

- Make contact with Council's Senior Traffic Engineer to discuss information required at (a) to (j)

- Be aware swept wheel path drawings, prepared by a suitably qualified and experienced traffic
  engineering consultant, may need to be submitted to Council for all truck movements that are to
  take place within the Council area prior to an approval being issued for the CVPPM.
- Be aware of and take into account the cumulative effect that truck movements from the
  development site and other development sites in the vicinity that are either under construction or
  have development approval will have on roads leading to and from the site".
