That Council:

1. Executive Summary

Council has received an application from the Central Synagogue requesting the temporary closure of Bon Accord Avenue, Bondi Junction, from Bon Accord Lane to Flood Lane, to facilitate the annual High Holy Days celebrations. Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

Due to the local government elections, the first ordinary Council meeting of the new term is on 29 October 2024. Council will therefore consider the recommendation of the Traffic Committee retrospectively.

2. Introduction/Background

The Central Synagogue has requested approval for the closure of Bon Accord Avenue in the section between Bon Accord Lane and Flood Lane during the following days and times:

- Thursday, 3 October 2024, 8.15 am-2.00 pm.
- Friday, 4 October 2024, 8.15 am–2.00 pm.
- Friday, 11 October 2024, 5.30 pm-10.00 pm.
- Saturday, 12 October 2024, 9.15 am–8.15 pm.

There are no changes to partial road closure points to those approved in previous year, and only minor changes to the time periods.

Council has prepared a Transport Management Plan (TMP) on behalf of the synagogue, including a Traffic Guidance Scheme (TGS); see Attachments 3 and 4. The applicant will be undertaking resident notification and submitting the TMP to Transport for NSW (TfNSW).

This is a Class 2 Special Event, with road closures being carried out in accordance with the TfNSW Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events. The Traffic Committee is required to make recommendations to Council regarding the traffic management aspects of the event including advising Council on conditions to set for the use of the road space.

Council will then consider these recommendations and assess all other impacts on the surrounding environment before issuing a schedule of conditions.

3. Technical Analysis

The attached TMP proposes that the closure be undertaken in the manner detailed in Table 1 below.

TfNSW will need to approve the temporary partial closure of part of Bon Accord Avenue with the TMP being forwarded for the authority's consideration, as the closure may affect Old South Head Road, which is a State Road. Once all approvals and conditions have been satisfied, staff from TfNSW as well as Council's Executive Manager, Infrastructure Services, can sign the TMP authorising its implementation.

Access for residents and visitors

Access for residents and visitors must be retained at all times. Residents and visitors needing access to properties along the route will be granted it.

Impacts on Old South Head Road shared path

There is a shared path along Old South Head Road north and south of Bon Accord Avenue.

Jersey kerb barriers have been placed on the edge of this shared path and on either side of Bon Accord Avenue at Old South Head Road in past years. These barriers must leave sufficient width for the shared path to serve its function. The minimum desirable width is 2.5 metres. It is recommended that this is reduced to 2 metres for the duration of the event to allow the placement of the barriers.

It is understood that a width of less than 2 metres has occurred in the past and that pedestrian movements have been impeded at Bon Accord Avenue. The Jersey kerbs are in place for the entire period of the four events plus bump-in and bump-out days prior and post-event. Council officers have received the application for foot traffic safety measures and will coordinate to minimise these potential issues.

There should be no blocking of pedestrian movements across Bon Accord Avenue at Old South Head Road.

Additional Conditions

In accordance with the TMP and TGS attached to the report, the following conditions apply:

- (a) The Event Organiser must:
 - (i) Engage a traffic control company approved by the Executive Manager, Infrastructure Services, to implement the TMP.
 - (ii) Facilitate access to residential properties affected by barriers for residents and visitors.
 - (iii) Provide public liability insurance for the event.
 - (iv) Obtain NSW Police approval.
 - (v) Submit the TMP to Transport for NSW for approval by the Transport Management Centre.
 - (vi) Notify affected residents as shown in Figure 1 of Attachment 3 of the report.
 - (vii) Provide a pre- and post-dilapidation report of the condition of footpaths and landscaping along the section of Old South Head Road and Bon Accord Avenue affected by the event.
- (b) Council may issue a schedule of conditions with any additional conditions that may be imposed by the NSW Police, TfNSW and the Executive Manager, Infrastructure Services.

1. Executive Summary

Council has received an application from the Chabad of Bondi Community Centre requesting the temporary partial closure of Hall Street, Bondi Beach, between Glenayr Avenue and Wellington Street, and Wellington Street, between Hall Street and Rudolph Lane, Bondi Beach, to facilitate the ceremonial opening of a new community centre.

Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

Due to the local government elections, the first ordinary Council meeting of the new term is on 29 October 2024. Council will therefore consider the recommendation of the Traffic Committee retrospectively.

2. Introduction/Background

The Chabad of Bondi has requested approval for the temporary partial closure of Hall Street, between Glenayr Avenue and Wellington Street, and then Wellington Street, between Hall Street and Rudolph Lane, Bondi Beach from 5.00 pm until 6.15 pm on 22 September 2024.

The ceremonial walk will commence at 5.15 pm at the southeast end of Hall Street. It will progress along Hall Street in a north-westerly direction until it reaches Wellington Street. The walk will proceed southwest on Wellington Street until 105 Wellington Street, the location of the new centre. The partial closure will extend to Rudolph Lane, located about 50 m further southwest of 105 Wellington Street. This will minimise disruption and more easily retain access to affected residences.



The applicant is preparing a Transport Management Plan (TMP) for the event including a Traffic Guidance Scheme. The TMP will incorporate conditions stated further below. The applicant will also be undertaking resident notification and submitting the TMP to Transport for NSW (TfNSW). A preliminary unofficial traffic guidance scheme is attached to this report.

This event has characteristics of a Class 4 Special Event per TfNSW's Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events, as it is a 'moving event' and a neighbourhood activity. Given the need for specific security considerations as part of the event, the Traffic Committee is being engaged to provide input to Council regarding the traffic management aspects of the event including advising Council on conditions to set for the use of the road space.

Council will then consider these recommendations and assess all other impacts on the surrounding environment before issuing a schedule of conditions including those set out below.

3. Technical Analysis

Table 1 below provides an outline of the event and proposed management plan. This will be detailed in the finalised TMP.

Once all approvals and conditions have been satisfied, including that from the Police, Council's Executive Manager, Infrastructure Services, can sign the TMP authorising its implementation.

Access for residents and visitors

Access for residents and visitors must be retained at all times. Residents and visitors needing access to properties along the route will be granted it; however, some minor delays may be anticipated.

Impacts to the network

The Hall Street and Wellington Street intersection is only to be partially impacted. Movements between the northeast arm of Hall Street and the northwest arm of Wellington Street will be maintained. These arms both provide two-way flows. Hall Street southeast of the intersection facilitates one-way travel in the northwest direction. As such, turning movements into Hall Street at this intersection are already not permitted. This means that impacts will be localised, and further minimised by traffic control at the intersection.

No impacts to the footpath network is anticipated, such that the roads remain open to public use at all times.

Additional conditions

In accordance with the forthcoming Transport Management Plan (TMP) and Traffic Guidance Schemes (TGS) attached to the report, the following conditions apply:

- (a) The Event Organiser must:
 - (i) Engage a traffic control company approved by the Executive Manager, Infrastructure Services, to implement the TMP.
 - (ii) Facilitate access to residential properties affected by barriers for residents and visitors.
 - (iii) Provide public liability insurance for the event.
 - (iv) Obtain NSW Police approval.
 - (v) Submit the TMP to Transport for NSW approval by the Transport Management Centre.
 - (vi) Notify affected residents living along Hall Street from Glenayr Avenue to Simpson Street and Wellington Street from O'Brien Street to Curlewis Street.
- (b) Council may issue a schedule of conditions with any additional conditions that may be imposed by the NSW Police, TfNSW and the Executive Manager, Infrastructure Services.

1. Executive Summary

Council has prepared the attached Traffic Management Plan (TMP) (Attachment 1) for the Festival of the Wind event to be held at Bondi Beach and Bondi Park on Sunday, 8 September 2024.

This is an annual event. The report recommends approval of the event with a request for Transport for NSW (TfNSW) to approve associated Clearways on Bondi Road, Campbell Parade and the first block of Hall St (on both sides of the road from Campbell Parade to Gould Street).

Council will need to exercise its delegated functions to implement the proposal.

Due to the local government elections, the first ordinary Council meeting of the new term is on 29 October 2024. Council will therefore consider the recommendation of the Traffic Committee retrospectively.

2. Introduction/Background

The Festival of the Winds is a free community event held in Bondi Park and Beach featuring professional kite flying displays, kite making workshops, entertainment, and food stalls. The event has experienced a high level of continued growth and now attracts 80,000+ visitors.

The event is expected to have impacts on transport and traffic networks both within the immediate vicinity of the event and the wider Waverley community.



Transdev John Holland Buses will provide increased bus services to accommodate the increased inflow and outflow of patrons attending the event. Sydney Trains will also provide additional train services to Bondi Junction.

Special Event Clearways

This is a Class 2 Special Event under the TfNSW's 'Guide to Traffic and Transport Management for Special Events'. Special Event Clearways will operate from 7 am to 7 pm on:

- Bondi Road, eastbound between Council and Sandridge Streets.
- Bondi Road, westbound between Sandridge and Council Streets.
- Hall Street, eastbound between Gould Street and Campbell Parade.
- Hall Street, westbound between Gould Street and Campbell Parade.

In addition, Special Event Clearways (authorised route buses excepted) will operate from 7 am until 7 pm on:

- Campbell Parade, southbound between the exit from Queen Elizabeth Drive and the entrance to Queen Elizabeth Drive.
- Campbell Parade, northbound between Hall and Roscoe Streets.
- Curlewis Street, eastbound between Gould Street and Campbell Parade.

Partial road closures - Bondi Beach

A partial closure of Queen Elizabeth Drive (5 am-7 pm) is proposed due to high pedestrian movements conflicting with vehicular traffic. Park Drive South parking area will be closed at Beach Road and Campbell parade (to non-event vehicles) from 5 am-7 pm.

A contingency partial road closure (residents and TransDev John Holland buses excepted) will be in place on Curlewis Street at Glenayr Avenue to manage the anticipated impact of the Curlewis Street roadworks on event bus (X81) services.

Partial road Closures - Bondi Junction

Partial Road closures (buses excepted) are also proposed for Bondi Junction from 10 am to 6 pm on Oxford Street (from Adelaide Street to Grosvenor Street), Grosvenor Street (from Spring to Grafton Streets), Grosvenor Lane (from Newland Street to Grosvenor Street) and Grafton Street (westbound) from Newland Street to Grosvenor Street. Below is an aerial image showing the affected area around Bondi Junction.



Figure 1. Area in Bondi Junction affected by partial road closures.

That the Committee notes the items approved in June and July 2024 under the Temporary Instrument of Delegation and Authorisation for Traffic Management and Pedestrian Works, as set out in the report.

1. Executive Summary

The purpose of this report is to notify the Waverley Traffic Committee and the public of items that have recently been carried out under Council's Temporary Sub-Delegations. A total of four items were approved through the Temporary Sub-Delegation, including installation and removal of mobility parking, a new construction zone, and the implementation of additional no-stopping areas on York Road, Bondi Junction.

2. Introduction/Background

In December 2023, Transport for NSW (TfNSW) issued the Temporary Instrument of Delegation and Authorisation for Traffic Management and Pedestrian Works. The Temporary Delegation will be in force until 30 June 2026, unless otherwise revised by TfNSW. On 21 May 2024, Council sub-delegated the functions in the instrument to the General Manager and the Director, Assets and Operations, on a trial basis until 30 June 2026.

The sub-delegation facilitates more efficient implementation of routine operational items. This results in fewer items requiring Traffic Committee input. The focus of ongoing Traffic Committee meetings will be on items that are not included in the temporary delegation, as well as those of a more complex nature or otherwise deemed appropriate for Traffic Committee review. This optimises voting member, participant, and council officer time.

All items that are approved under the temporary sub-delegation must be presented to the Traffic Committee post-approval or implementation, in accordance with schedule 4, item 10 of the instrument. As such, the purpose of this report is to notify the Traffic Committee and the public of items approved under the temporary sub-delegation in Part 2 of the Traffic Committee agenda.

3. Technical Analysis

The items presented in Table 1 below are those approved under the temporary sub-delegation. This means that they have or will be implemented in due course. However, in some cases the ultimate timing for implementation is dependent on applicants or external parties (e.g. construction zones).
